Word from the Pastor

The Living Saviour

One of the most heart-breaking sights for me to walk away from, is the sight of the 'so-called' picture of Jesus that hangs amongst many other images of worship. The understanding is that Jesus is like any other 'god' and having this image will add his favour along with others. The bible says in 2 Corinthians 4:4 'The god of this age has blinded the minds of unbelievers, so that they cannot see the light of the gospel that displays the glory of Christ, who is the image of God.'

I choose to remind ourselves of this important truth in this message because I hear this statement more and more, even from many 'Christians'. The statement is 'They have their faith and we have our faith'. Really!! Is it possible even for the elect and the taught and disciples to be deceived? There is only ONE Saviour. There is only ONE way to Heaven. There is only ONE who died 'literally' and rose from the dead 'literally'. His name is JESUS. One can claim to be a Hindu, Muslim, Buddhist, Atheist, Agnostic, Catholic or anything else. FOR ALL MANKIND THERE IS ONLY ONE SAVIOUR 'JESUS'. Not Jesus and ______.

The Implications of this clear uncompromising uncomplicated truth are the following:

1. He alone is the living Saviour

The 'saviours' of the world who gave great teachings, philosophies and promises to their followers are not alive. They came, lived, taught and DIED. Everyone of them died. Jesus died but HE IS NOT DEAD. Socrates died, Vivekananda died, Mary (Jesus' mother) died. They ARE DEAD TODAY. JESUS IS ALIVE. The reason is that only Jesus is

the Saviour. Jesus is God and Jesus alone is GOD. John 6:38 says 'For I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will but the will of him who sent me.' Another explicit reference is in Mark 14:61-62

2. He alone is the Interceding Saviour

Romans 8:34 says Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us. Read the verse one more time and ask 'who can make a similar claim of their heavenly position and authority'. ONLY JESUS. Hebrews 7:25 reads 'Therefore He is able to save completely those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to intercede for them.'

3. He alone is the Soon-Returning Saviour

This is THE ONE DEFINING TRUTH about the Saviour. No one else is coming back for the disciples. But the Bible clearly states that Jesus is coming again. Those who are disciples of Jesus can wait in expectation. Those who add 'religious customs and traditions', cultural ideologies or just plainly follow any other 'saviour' who they think can and will help them, will be found 'agonizingly' wanting. John 14:3 says 'And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am.' NONE, I mean, NONE can dare to make such promises.

There are many options to travel from place to place, there are many options to earn the same degree, there are many options for the kind of clothes to wear. BUT THERE IS ONLY ONE WAY TO HEAVEN. Jesus said, 'I am the way, the truth and the life, no one comes to the Father except through me'. (John 14:6). The Living Saviour is coming Soon. Many are not bothered! How about you??

The Dawn of Hope

The hope of Easter day springs from the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, on the 3rd day after his crucifixion.

Jesus was dead. John saw him die a horrendous death, the blood draining out from him for 6 agonising hours. So did Mary his mother. His body was wrapped in a shroud and buried in a rock hewn cave. There was a terrible finality to the whole event.

Can you imagine what his disciples felt? They had been on cloud 9, on the previous Sunday. They were the chosen followers of a rabbi, a magnetic leader, a miracle worker. His popularity was so great that the inhabitants of Jerusalem had met him on the way with shouts of welcome. He could have been a Roman General returning to Rome after a victorious war. All that remained was the acceptance by Jesus of the kingly crown the crowds were prepared to give to this Son of David.

Suddenly, the tide turned. The disciples had not taken into account a traitor in their midst. Nor had they estimated the hatred and craftiness of the priests and elders and scribes. Threatened by the popularity of Jesus, they manipulated the Roman Governor to condemn him to crucifixion. In 6 hours he was dead. On the night before, he was in the full flower of his manhood, dining and praying with them, but by next afternoon, he was a lifeless body.

What of his disciples, huddled together, hiding from the High Priest and the Roman authorities? They were consumed by fear of the same fate befalling them, grief and shame for fleeing from him, and despair that the teachings, the miracles, the fellowship, and the love of Jesus for each of them, had all come to nothing. Into this scenario, breaks forth the first resurrection appearance of Jesus. They cried aloud as at a ghost. The Bible says that after he wished them peace and showed them his pierced hands and side, "then were the disciples glad, when they saw the Lord." That is an understatement. Their master had come back from death. Never before had a man come back alive after death. It went against the grain of natural life on this planet. No wonder Thomas did not believe. But our compassionate Lord appeared again

and showed Thomas the proof he wanted. The faith that came to life in Thomas and the others was never to be dimmed again.

But the disciples could not carry on just hugging this wonderful revelation to themselves. Peter, John and James could not go back to fishing. Thomas could not keep on rejoicing that the Lord Jesus had taken so much pains to convince him. Jesus told them they had to witness to His Resurrection, and to empower them to do so, He breathed on them the Holy Spirit. "Ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem and in all Judaea and in Samaria and unto the uttermost parts of the earth." And that was how Peter's sermon on the Day of Pentecost to a huge crowd gathered in Jerusalem, took place. He did not mince words. "Ye men of Israel, ye have taken Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God by miracles, wonders and signs and have crucified him. This Jesus had God raised up, whereof we are all witnesses." (Acts 2:32). "Let all the house of Israel know assuredly that that same Jesus, whom you have crucified, is both Lord and Christ." (Acts 2:36) Then the conscience-stricken people asked, "What shall we do?" Then Peter said, "Repent and be baptised in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins." And they would receive eternal life. There you have in a nutshell the Gospel of Jesus Christ. This is what the disciples, every one of them, took to the corners of the earth, careless of their own safety, and imbued with a gay abandon. They were all (except John) martyred, but every one of them died with hope and full faith in Jesus' promise of death opening out into the fullness of life.

An army of believers has followed the apostles down the ages till the present day, many of them famous, thousands of them ordinary folk, not afraid to face death because of the Easter hope.

My remembrance book contains a landmark that I greatly value. Long, long ago with the eagerness of an eighteen year old, I travelled from Madras to Nagpur to attend my Graduation Day. It was an exciting trip as four of us, chums through school and college, were to meet and stay for a few weeks at our friend's place which happened to be the home of her father a zamindar. The hospitality was lavish and our days were filled with movies, picnics, delectable food, visits to their old rural estates and best of all, the laughter and cosy chats we were glad to share before we went on our separate ways.

On returning home, I recounted with euphoria my fairy tale holiday. My father gently said, "My girl, this is not what life is all about." I felt like Cinderalla when her clock struck 12. My glittering coach became a plain pumpkin.

God in His mercy does gift us with seasons and moments of love, comfort and wonder. It could be the gaze of a loved one, the warmth of home after a rough day, the laughter of humour, or maybe just moist eyes recollecting lingering memories.

Jesus asks us to consider the winsome, wild lilies of the field. They neither toil nor spin and yet are more radiantly clothed than an emperor. Here Jesus certainly did not advocate a life of ease and laziness. He condemned our relentless worry about the future when we should be trusting our Heavenly Father.

Medical Corner

LAZY EYE

Doctors treat but Jesus heals

"Open thou mine eyes, that I may behold wondrous things out of thy law," the psalmist prays. He may be referring to our inner vision but there is no doubt that the ability to see is perhaps the most vital gift of God. The following article will help us appreciate how "fearfully and wonderfully" God has made our eyes to work together to grant us perfect vision. It also gives us hope by explaining ways and means of dealing with any impairment.

When we look at any object, the right eye forms one image and the left eye forms another image and these two images are fused as "one single image" by the brain! On account of this, we have 3D vision, stereopsis and depth perception.

In children, when vision is poor in one eye, due to cross eyes (squint), or when one eye has very high minus or plus power (high refractive error, eg. myopia or hypermetropia), the image formed in that eye, will be hazy or fuzzy, and the brain will not be able to fuse the images as one. This happens especially when the other eye is normal. Good image from one eye and poor quality image from the other eye cannot be fused. The brain therefore will suppress the eye with poor vision and make it lazy (amblyopic) or sleepy. The child will see only with the good eye.

This can also happen when a baby is born with any congenital problem of one eye like congenital cataract, glaucoma, improper development of one eye, etc. This is a dangerous condition because the child never complains, since, he can see very well with the other eye. The parents and teachers also do not notice any vision defect, and lazy eye is mostly recognized when the child undergoes a routine eye check at the school or at the doctor's office.

The problem leading to poor vision must be identified and corrected at a very early age before the eye becomes lazy. The appropriate power is given in the form of spectacles and the good eye is occluded with a rubber occluder or with pad and bandage. This will compel the child to use the weak eye, which will slowly regain good vision. Special orthoptic exercises are also given to stimulate the lazy eye. The prognosis is good if the child is treated before the age of 10 years. It is important to get every child checked periodically for any congenital eye problem I eye defect.
