Word From the Pastor

DIED FOR A CAUSE

God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. (2 Corinthians 5:21)

Another year, another lent season!! Is that how we are going to *celebrate* the season or are we going to desire a more biblical approach or a Christ-like approach in living our lives. Read the above verse one more time and ask yourself these questions? What was the *selfish* reason for Jesus to die on the Cross? What was the *purpose* for His death on the Cross? In a world that has moved into selfish, self-centred plans and dreams, the Cross stands as a dilemma that cannot be easily explained or brushed aside. As someone said so beautifully, Cross is the only place where '*the Hero died for the villain*' I want to remind all of us of some key features about the Cross that will help us *celebrate* Jesus more and more even as the world rejects Him more and more.

1. Jesus embraced the Cross *because* it was the will of the Father. God the Father had a purpose in sending His only begotten into the world so that we might live through Him (1 John 4:9). The prayer at the garden of Gethsemane is such a heart-wrenching moment where Jesus who is God, knew about the impending events, yet prayed for the will of His Father. A Cross that had a Cause



2. The Cause was not just a philosophical concept or a theological position that can be explained and discussed. The Cause was the *'Salvation of Mankind'*. The word 'we' in the above verse includes all mankind from the pauper to the Pope, from the pastor to the pew member. All are lost and all have sinned. All are without a possibility of redemption but for the blood of Jesus. The criminal on the cross is a sinner just as the high priest in his priestly robes is. All have sinned and fallen short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23).

3. The Cause is a destiny – the righteousness of God. Galatians 5:17 says 'Now if we are children, then we are heirs—heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we share in his sufferings in order that we may also share in his glory'. From hell-bound to being heavenbound, we needed a Saviour and His name is JESUS.

Jesus died for a cause. He came, lived and died for a cause outside Himself. I thank God for raising martyrs who followed in the footsteps of Jesus to die for a cause beyond themselves. The question is, all of us may not die as martyrs for the gospel of Jesus Christ. Can we at least resolve to '**live for a cause**'. Seek God's will, seek God's guidance, seek God's strength, seek that through your life God should be glorified.

Ash Wednesday

The church commences the journey to Calvary and the Easter garden with the observance of Ash Wednesday. Many churches particularly Catholic, burn the palms used on the previous Palm Sunday and super impose the ashes on the foreheads of worshippers, tracing the sign of the cross and saying, "Remember that thou art dust and to dust, thou wilt return."

It may be of interest to know how the early Christian churches especially in Latin America observed the beginning of Lent, how they finished off what was left in the larder. They indulged in throwing bucket fuls of water or exploding plastic bags of water on the streets - a relic of the sprinkling with holy water. This was more of a frolic known as Mardi Gras. In England they had the pancake throwing races, ensuring fasting from rich foods. These are inherited religious customs, to show the need to set aside the frailites and trivialities which fill our lives before a new beginning can take place on Ash Wednesday.

Today, the Christian Church calls upon its members to repent of their ways as a preparation for Easter. The Messiah who rode the donkey on Palm Sunday died for our sins in a most horrific manner on the Cross. He had spent 40 days of fasting in the desert to know the path he had to tread, to save man from his inevitable extinction. The devil placed before him temptations to swerve from God's mission for him. He dangled before him the power to perform miracles which would glorify only his own superior gift-the ability to turn stones into bread.

The devil then enticed him to test God to ascertain for himself the protection of his Father. He answered the devil that one should not tempt God. The devil then showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their glory, he could have them all if only he worshipped the evil powers and gave into sin. Jesus resorted to the Word of God to resist these temptations. So Lent is the time given to us to learn to live by the Word of God. It is a time to repent of the times we have yielded to

sin, and seek God's forgiveness-a time to turn from something and a turning to something, "a time for losing and a time for keeping" (Ecclesiastes).

Today people don't believe in the devil. They choose to believe they are all right as long as they live a good life. But they fail to realise that leading a good life means living with compromises. But the call of God is to resist evil. We must seek to name evil for what it is, and rely on God to keep us from evil. We may fall at times, but God is always ready to forgive and enable us to start again. It is with this spirit of repentance and confident hope in forgiveness that we should begin Lent.

So far we have dealt with the authentic followers of God and their perspective on the obligations of Lent. Now follows a true story of how modern people of no particular religious perception come to faith in Jesus. There was this couple who led the life of normal young people in London. They came home from Work, ate their prepacked meal from the microwave and then slumped in front of the television till bed time. As they switched off the set, one of them said, "There must be more to life than this". They talked about it till late in the night. Neither of them was religious, and they were not church goers. But they decided to attend church the following Sunday to see if God had any answers for them. They met the pastor and after much discussion, many days later they were baptized and confirmed. They discovered God and found a deeper meaning and purpose in their lives.

The Passion Play at Oberammergau, Germany – an experience to cherish

My daughter in the USA invited me to join her on a trip to Europe in 2010. The highlight of this odyssey would be to view the historic Passion Play at the village Oberammergau. The play is enacted every 10 years.

We left Dallas for Munich, Germany. The airport is lively and I looked around with wide-eyed interest. At the airport we had breakfast – croissants with ham and cheese. I gaped at the 'biergarten' in the airport's courtyard where people were enjoying beer at 10 a.m, till my daughter nudged me to move on!

We rented a car and drove from Munich to Ettal. The hotel was charming and monastic with entrancing views of the Bavarian Mountains from our bedroom windows. We dined on delicious fish, herbed potatoes and soup for dinner.

The next day was Sunday and we felt refreshed after a good night's rest. We looked around this beautiful place Ettal, girded with mountains. We visited a market run by the Benedictine monks. We met two ruddy-cheeked young monks sipping a warm drink and helping themselves to warm candied almonds. They kindly offered us mulled wine and almonds. I would gladly have accepted but my Puritanic daughter frowned.

From Ettal we caught a shuttle to the village, Oberammergau. Tourists from all over the world had assembled with eager hearts to watch the play which was to commence at 2.30 in the afternoon. The tradition dates back to 1633 when the villagers underwent an agonising Thirty

year old war, leading to months of suffering, and dying of the Plague that afflicted them. It was during those dark times that the villagers had vowed to stage the suffering, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. There were no more deaths due to the plague and the villagers have kept their pledge for over 375 years. This Bavarian village has about 5,000 inhabitants. Over 2,500 of them participate in this play as performers, musicians, choir and in the maintenance of the 40 metre wide open air stage.

The village is so pretty, the air soft and balmy that the whole place looked like it was spun out of dreams. The greenery around was spangled with flowers of various hues. The ever-present Bavarian Alps stood in arrogant loveliness. The atmosphere was timeless.

The play commenced with Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The stage was stark but the scene captured the crowd's frenzy, the rush, the shouts, the palms waving to welcome our Lord who came riding on a live ass. The scenes had living pictures of the Sadducean priesthood, the vulgar but lucrative bazaar in the court of the Gentiles, the rulers, and the appointed officers of justice. Etched in my memory is the sublime dignity of Jesus during the trial.

The laceration of Christ was graphic and painful to watch. The placing of the cross in its socket with the nailed body of Jesus made me recall the words of the psalmist in 22:14 "I am poured out like water and all my bones are out of joint".

The play ended with the glorious resurrection. It was accompanied by uplifting rhapsodic music of the choir and orchestra. One could exalt the Lord with Job, "I know that my Redeemer lives" 19:25.

Each of us, 4,700 spectators would have known, read and heard this sacred story over and over again. And yet when we experience vicariously a play of this excellence, the truth resonates with us like a "rich chord from the belly of a guitar". There remained with me a glow of emotional and spiritual restoration. Thank you, Jesus!

Medical Corner

HOW DO WE SEE?

Doctors treat but Jesus heals

We all know that the camera has a lens, which focuses the objects we want to click, on the film roll. Similarly, our eye has " cornea" and "lens" (living!) made of clear crystalline protein which focus the objects we see on to the retina, which is the innermost layer of the eye. The retina is our natural film roll! The image on the retina, is then transferred to the brain through a system of nerves known as the visual pathway. The brain processes the images from both the eyes and fuses them as one image and then we are able to see, what we are looking at. This is comparable to the development of the film roll in the dark room in a photo-studio. Our brain is our photo-studio. Any disease affecting, the eye or the brain can result in decreased, blurred or loss of vision.

We not only have "central" vision but also "side" vision (field of vision), which helps us to move about freely, cross the road, drive etc. Some diseases of the retina and brain, can cause defects in the field of vision. A common eye disease "glaucoma", damages the optic nerve and causes field loss.

Since our eyes are situated in the front of the face, we have depth perception, 3D view of images, and stereopsis, which most animals (e.g. Rabbits, Deer) birds, snakes, fish, do not enjoy! Their eyes are located on the side of the head, to have a very large visual field, so as to detect predators quickly and escape. 'This also' helps them to locate their prey easily. We also have colour vision and are able to enjoy this beautiful world in rainbow colours.

Yes Fake Sells - All Artificial things - Counterfeits/ Duplicates Sell - and sometimes are better than the Original. Today men have created artificial beaches in Dubai. There are artificial ocean like aquariums in Dubai and Singapore which create a replica of real under water life. Yes, as long as fake things are for entertainment – they are fine – but when used in the real world can cause huge trouble. Fraud today is all around us. Today we have fake jewellery, fake flowers - fake laughter clubs to make people laugh. Observational studies state that 80 to 90% people laugh at things which are not funny (TOI, Nov 3, 2016). People say Fake it to make it. There are artificially created fake opinions and ratings to sell products and innocent people are fooled into buying them.

Deception has entered our lives. Cheque Forgery of Signatures, Credit Cards thefts – ATM pin number thefts / Many stealing from Bank

Accounts posing as Fake Bank Officials has caused Cybercrime police to quickly catch the culprits. The **wrong person gives the wrong impression** to us in elections and we end up voting for the wrong candidate and hence the wrong Govt. There are Fake Police Inspectors, Fake Tax Officials but the Truth comes out at last.

Another area of faking is in health, where we are led to pop pills that are not required but help to fatten the profits of pharma companies. Obesity through fattening foods is another case of faking and the ad industry plays a big role in levering the process. Today Some Cricket Matches Results are tampered with, Lottery winners are unreal. The system of ranking educational institutions and examinations is also warped. Even innovations involve frauds because of copying from others and claiming credit for it. The Bible has also instances of such faking. Rebekah faked Jacob to be Esau and got the blessings from Isaac (Gen 25:33). Isaac faked his wife Rebekah to be his sister in front of Abimelech King of Philistines Gen 26:7-9. What does the Bible teach us about how to deal with and overcome Faking?

Lesson 1: God Calls us to be Authentic Christians because Jesus himself is The Truth – Authentic Christians are marked by thankfulness and prayer, faith in Christ, love for saints and genuineness in living for Christ Colossians 1:3-8. Mathew 7:16-18 states that we need to bear good fruit which is real inside. Judas was an example of a fake disciple. King Herod faked his intention to get information of the baby Jesus from the wise men. There are many people who pretend to be followers of Christ but only a few are chosen. Matt 22:14. Am I also an honest truthful Christian following Christ IN ALL ASPECTS?

Lesson 2: God Calls us "Be Part of the Solution & Not Part of the Problem "- God calls us to actively take part in the solution of truth and not be a part of the problem. There are many spectators who do not take part in the solution and these people are "people sitting on the fence". God calls us to be disciples who impact and transform the hearts of men (Matt 28:20) and expose False Teachers and Prophets through God's word and our personal testimony. Am I a PART OF THE SOLUTION or a MERE SPECTATOR?

Lesson 3: God calls us to "Use Discernment of the Spirit" to identify What is right & What is wrong – There will be many situations when you will need to depend on the Holy spirit to identify what is correct (I John 4:1) and what is not correct because on the mere face of it – it might look good and fine – but later you find that they are actually not right at all. Acts 5:9. Do I use the DISCERNMENT of the Spirit to Judge the Truth?

In conclusion, we need to understand – that we need to be truthful – from the smallest to the biggest things in our lives because Ps 14:2 says The Lord looks down from heaven. Yes, we need to be actively part of the solution and use the discernment of the Holy Spirit to understand the authenticity of any task to be done.




